The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation as it is known today was established in 1953 by the Federal Republic of Germany. The Foundation enables highly-qualified postdoctoral scientists and experienced researchers, from abroad, to carry out research projects of their own choice in Germany. There are no quotas for individual countries or disciplines. The foundation allows the researchers to choose their host institutions themselves and to conduct independent research without any stipulations. Applicants are responsible for choosing their own research project and host in Germany.

"Once a Humboldtian – always a Humboldtian" is the hallmark of the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation. Humboldt sponsorship is enduring: the Foundation is a lifetime partner, maintaining the connections on a long-term basis through its alumni sponsorship programs. As a result, an active knowledge network of more than 30,000 Humboldtians has been laid across the whole academic world – embracing over 140 states.





### Freie Universität Berlin

Freie Universität Berlin is a young, international university with a unique history. It is one of the very few universities in Germany that succeeded three times to receive funding through the Excellence initiative. Located in the quiet southwestern part of Berlin, the university is part of one of the largest research sites in Europe. The broadest spectrum of research in the humanities in Germany at Freie Universität Berlin comes together under the auspices of the Dahlem Humanities Center. The Center for Area Studies clusters the regional studies research on North and Latin America, Eastern Europe, East Asia, the Middle East, and individual European countries. The Otto Suhr Institute of Political Science is the largest political science, as well as the life sciences and Earth sciences. The broad spectrum also includes the Department of Veterinary Medicine, one of only five veterinary schools in Germany. Charité – Universitätsmedizin Berlin is the medical school jointly operated by Freie Universität Berlin and Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin.





## **Philipps-Universität Marburg**

Philipps-Universität Marburg is one of the leading institutions for research and study in central Germany. It stands for close involvement with recognized research groups, a student body that graduates faster than average, and exemplary support of young scholars and researchers. The university, which has been established almost 500 years ago, today counts around 24,000 students. It offers 207 study programs in 16 departments with 96 bachelor's and 72 master's programs in almost all fields of study, except engineering. The state examination (Staatsexamen) is offered in human medicine, dental medicine, pharmacy, law and religious studies. It has established 300 international cooperations in higher education and takes special care of its more than 14% international students and researchers. Philipps-Universität Marburg proudly counts 11 Nobel Prize- and 13 Leibniz Prize winners and is top-ranked in various disciplines. The "THAMM Plus" Programme is a regional one commissioned by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and is co-funded by the European Union. It is implemented in Egypt in cooperation with the Ministry of State for Emigration and Egyptian Expatriates' Affairs and the Ministry of Education and Technical Education. It builds on THAMM I with the objective of increasing employability and labour mobility for potential migrant workers in North African countries and EU members states. THAMM Plus focuses on anchoring development and demand-oriented regular migration and mobility approaches by further building partnerships as well as adapting and institutionalizing established processes within the partners' systems.
