<b>Learning Outcome:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Participants will be able to identify the most common obstetric emergencies requiring ICU admission (e.g., preeclampsia/eclampsia, HELLP syndrome, postpartum hemorrhage, sepsis, amniotic fluid embolism).</li><li>2. Participants will be able to explain the physiological changes in pregnancy that can influence the presentation and management of critical illness.</li><li>3. Participants will be able to outline a systematic approach to the assessment and resuscitation of critically ill pregnant and postpartum patients</li><li>4. Participants will be able to discuss the role of mechanical ventilation, hemodynamic monitoring, and other ICU therapies in managing obstetric emergencies.</li><li>5. Participants will be able to identify potential complications associated with critical illness during pregnancy and postpartum period.</li><li>6. Participants will be able to participate in discussions about specific management strategies for different obstetric emergencies (e.g., anticonvulsant use in eclampsia, blood product transfusion in postpartum hemorrhage).</li><li>7. Participants will be able to discuss the psychological impact of critical illness on pregnant and postpartum women and their families</li></ol>
